# Amnesty International Lists Over 100 Detained Journalists

LONDON, April 28 (Reuters)—Amnesty International published yesterday a list of more than 100 journalists who it said were imprisoned or detained for political reasons or have disappeared in 25 countries.

The London-based human rights group said many of them were being held without charge or trial and that some have been subjected to torture.

It said the list was far from comprehensive, both in the number of imprisoned journalists and in the number of countries where journalists were detained.

"The fact that a country is not included only means that any such cases have not been taken up by or come to the attention of Amnesty International," it said.

## Some Names Omitted

The group added that some names had been omitted because it was believed publicity would not be helpful to the prisoners involved.

The countries named were Argentina, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Brazil, Chile, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Haiti, Indonesia, Kenya, Malawi, the Philippines, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Syria, Taiwan, Tanzania, Thailand, Turkey, The Soviet Union, Uruguay and Yugoslavia.
